Improvements in Scent Bottles

- We, VERRERIES POCHET ET DU COURVAL (S.A.R.L.), a Company incorporated according to the laws of the Republic of France, of 121, Quai de Valmy, Paris, France, do hereby declare the nature of this invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement:—
- 10 The invention relates to improvements in scent bottles. It is concerned more particularly with a new presentation of this kind of bottles, intended to give them a more artistic character and at the same time to differentiate them distinctly from similar bottles.
- 15 The invention comprises dressing a bottle of ordinary form, the capacity of which is variable, by covering it with a sort of glass hood which is produced by moulding or by hand and is of suitable form and which may or may not be provided with a decoration painted or produced, for example, by means of mouldings in relief or in intaglio on one of the two faces and adapted to be perceived by transparency.
- 20 This hood is provided in its upper part with an orifice for the engagement of the scent bottle neck which projects slightly. The connection between the two parts is ensured by any suitable means and preferably by means permitting also their separation.
- 35 For a thorough understanding of the invention, it will be described more particularly with reference to the accompanying drawing showing a construction by way of example.
- 40 At 1 is indicated a blown glass bottle of variable form and capacity containing the odorous liquid, the airtightness of which is ensured in the ordinary manner by means of a ground-glass stopper 2.
- 45 The neck 3 has on its periphery two circular grooves 5, the function of which will be explained hereinafter. Fitting on the neck is an internally and externally screwthreaded metal ring 7 resting by means of a lower flange 8 on a shoulder 4 provided at the lower end of the neck. The ring 7 also has an upper flange 9 resting on the upper end of the neck 3. The ring 7 is held on the neck 3 of the bottle 1 by means of any desired sealing material which fills the circular grooves 5 and overflows into the internal screwthreads of the said ring.
- 55 The part 10 intended for dressing the bottle 1 may have any desired form and in the example shown it assumes the form of a hood. This part 10 is produced by moulding and may or may not be provided with a decoration painted or produced by means of mouldings in relief or in intaglio on one of its two faces and adapted to be seen by transparency. In its upper part, this hood has a central orifice 11, the diameter of which is such as to permit freely the passage of the neck 3 of the bottle 1 covered with its metal ring 7. The metal ring 7 being placed in position on the neck 3 of the bottle 1, the neck thus covered is inserted in the orifice 11 of the hood 10 until the lower flange 8 rests under the hood 10 with interposition of plastic joints 12. The screw-threaded ring 7 thus projects to the exterior of this part 10, so that it is possible to engage on the external threads of the said part a washer or nut 13 which serves to ensure the firmness of the assemblage formed by the bottle 1 and its hood 10, by locking the latter on the bottle.
- 60 Obviously, the hood may be given any suitable form.
- 65 It will likewise be remarked that the connecting device described is only given by way of example. This method of manufacture makes it possible to obtain, in the presentation of luxury bottles, decorative effects which it would be impossible to produce directly on the bottle itself by a glass-blowing operation.
- 70 Having now particularly described and ascertained the nature of our said invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, we declare that what we claim is:—
- 75 1. A scent bottle comprising an ordinary bottle dressed by covering it with a sort of glass hood of any desired form, produced by moulding or by any other means and assembled with the bottle by an appropriate connection.
- 80 2. A construction of the scent bottle as claimed in Claim 1, in which the connection of the hood to the bottle is pro-
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duced by providing the said bottle with a metal ring completely capping the bottle neck, on which it is sealed in a suitable manner.

- 5 3. A scent bottle as claimed in Claim 2, in which the capped neck passes freely through an orifice in the hood for receiving a nut or washer engaged on an external screwthread of the metal ring and
10 locking the hood on the bottle.

4. The scent bottle substantially as described with reference to the accompanying drawing.
