COMPLETE SPECIFICATION.

Improvements relating to Wine and like Glasses.

I, CLAUDE ERNEST HAYLOR, of Royal Hotel, Bideford, North Devon, a British subject, do hereby declare the nature of this invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, to be particularly described and ascertained in and by the following statement:

This invention relates especially to an improvement in a wine glass or like glass having a flat or sloping foot such as those used for liqueurs or cocktails. It is found that however carefully the wine or other liquid is poured out, served or mixed, there is usually a slight overflow over the edge of the bowl of the glass and down the side of the latter and this is especially so in the case of cocktails or liqueurs, where the liquid is of a somewhat oily nature and the flow in pouring cannot be cut off sharply. Such overflow with the usual glasses may fall on to the drinker's clothes, or if not will run down on to the tablecloth or the like, and cause stains or other objectionable marks. It is the object of the present invention to remedy this.

It has already been proposed to provide a drinking vessel, and in particular a cup and saucer made in one piece, with an inverse curved base turned over and inwards at the outside part thereof to form an upstanding rim to prevent the overflow from the vessel spilling over the edge of the base when the cup is used, or tilted over for the purpose of drinking.

My invention consists in the combination in a wine glass of a conical foot with an upturned rim moulded round the outer edge of the foot, or with a circum-

ferential channel moulded therein in the course of manufacture.

The accompanying drawing illustrates the invention and shows an upstanding rim moulded on the foot of the glass.

Referring to the drawing the foot *a* of the glass *b* is shown as of the sloping type and has a circumferential upstanding rim *c* moulded thereon in the course of manufacture. In another form of the invention however, instead of having an upstanding rim a channel might be moulded in the glass.

Having now particularly described and ascertained the nature of my said invention and in what manner the same is to be performed, I declare that what I claim is:—

1. A wine glass or like glass of the type having a conical foot, and an upturned rim moulded round the outer edge of the foot substantially as described.

2. A wine glass provided with a conical foot, having a circumferential channel moulded therein for the purpose and substantially as described.
